Organizer reserves the right of refusal to any stall not within the guidelines of the market or selling merchandise that is not approved.

- The Market will be held every Sunday of the month on the Waterfront City/ New Quay promenade Docklands. If cancelled we will inform you in advance.
- Market opening hours are from 10 am until 5 pm. Setup 1 hour before, cleanup 1 hour after.
- All stallholders are requested to maintain their stall in a clean and tidy manner and **must take away all unsold items, boxes, paper and wrappings.**
- **Pets (including fish) cannot be sold, nor illegal goods.**
- Stallholders **MUST NOT SELL, UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES, ANY COUNTERFEIT or COPIED GOODS or STOLEN GOODS.** Legal action may ensue.
- **Alcohol, tobacco, firearms, explosives, poisons or pornography is NOT permitted for sale.** Alcohol is NOT permitted to be consumed within the market. **No electrical goods can be sold.**
- **The Market Management reserves the right to refuse admission** to the Market to any person without giving any reason and to eject or cause to be ejected any person and/or his/her goods and chattels without giving any reason. This decision is final and binding.
- Stallholders are responsible for complying with all laws, rules and regulations relating to the goods offered for sale.
- **Permits will be required for the sale of any kind of food including fruit and vegetables** from the Melbourne City Council Health Department and the Market Management.
- **The stall space is defined by the markings of a single car parking space with a 3m by 3m tent** in front display of goods and operation shall be confined to this space will not encroach into the aisle.
- Car movement within the market must be 1 hour before market opening and 1 hour after market closing. The driver shall be totally and legally responsible for parking and movement of the vehicle and may not leave until market finishes.
- Second hand Stallholders trading repetitively may require a second-hand dealer's license. Refer to our web site for more details on the application form. It is the stallholder's responsibility to produce a current license if requested by police.
- Insurance - a Public and Product Liability Insurance is included in the stall fee. Stallholders are responsible for any excess payment on the policy if a claim is made.
- The Market Management shall not be liable for any person using these premises for personal injury or loss stock or damage whatsoever arising whether by negligence or otherwise incurred or suffered by that person.
- **Stallholders must ensure all their display equipment, eg tents, tables, are securely fixed (eg with sandbags and/or weights).**
- **No dogs are allowed in the market unless on a leash.**
- **Cars placed along the wooden planks on the water side must not under any circumstances embark or disembark or unload on water side to do so is at your own risk and not be accepted**
- **Booking of space and positioning of stallholders are the responsibility of the Market Manager.**
- **Entry by stallholders Arrival time 9am or otherwise by instruction at Doepel Way No enter passed bollards before Market coordinator arrives stay in line either side of road do not block entry to apartments.** No entry after 10.00am Stalls may be re-let to others **WITHOUT refund, no exit before 5pm**

Stall spaces may be booked and paid for one week in advance if available, payment by cheque or money order to Urban Acorn Pty Ltd. **Cancellation is accepted no later than Wednesday** and booking may be moved to another day if space is available. Only one cancellation is allowed.

No refunds if stall holders do not show up on the day in line with all other City Markets.

RE: SUPPLY OF GOODS SUBJECT TO PRODUCT SAFETY MANDATORY STANDARDS AND BANS

Consumer Affairs Victoria ("CAV"), along with other Australian consumer protection agencies, is responsible for administering the Australian Consumer Law ("ACL"). The ACL provides for the making of safety standards and bans of consumer goods and product related services to prevent or reduce the risk of injury to any person.

CAV is committed to ensuring Victorians become responsible and informed traders and consumers through the provision of advice and education, to ensure products offered for sale in Victoria meet the required safety standards and products are used safely as intended.

One of CAV's focus areas in 2012 is to ensure that baby products offered for sale in Victoria meet required safety standards. CAV will be targeting household and portable cots, prams and strollers, baby dummies, baby walkers, and child restraint systems for use in motor vehicles, all of which are subject to mandatory safety standards.

Officers from CAV will be visiting markets across Victoria to inspect baby products for compliance with mandatory safety standards.

As the market managers of suppliers' of goods to consumers in Victoria, CAV asks that you provide copies of the enclosed flyers, to your relevant stallholders operating within your market. This information will ensure that stallholders will have awareness of their obligations to supply baby and children products that meet mandatory safety standards.

Infant and nursery products



There are bans and mandatory standards for infant and nursery products in Australia.

It's your responsibility to know what they are.

Every year many children in Australia need hospital treatment for injuries caused by infant and nursery products.

You must make sure the products you supply comply with Australian product safety laws.

In 2012, Consumer Affairs Victoria inspections will focus on:

- baby dummies
- baby walkers
- child car restraints
- household and portable cots
- prams and strollers.

Bans or mandatory standards apply to these products. It's your responsibility to know what they are.

Visit productsafety.gov.au for all current safety warnings, bans and standards.

Update – permanent bans

Permanent bans apply to baby dummies, and baby dummy chains, if they have decorations that don't meet the relevant Australian standards. These bans came into force on 9 September 2011.

Dangers:

These products have small parts that a baby could swallow or inhale. Babies and infants risk choking, injury, illness and even death.

Decorations can include:

Beads, crystals and other similar ornaments.



The new *Product safety guide for business* will be distributed in April 2012. This will help you:

- further understand Australia's national product safety laws
- ensure you supply products that comply with those laws.
